Home Study Guidance 2019 – 2020

Home study is an integral part of all courses at all year groups giving students practice and consolidation of classwork, individual practice, extending learning and opportunities to improve reading and comprehension of texts. It is also an opportunity for students to develop their own time planning and develop good study skills.

Below we provide an indication of the amount of home study across subjects and year groups. It is not expected that home study is completed on the day it is set. Students (with parental support) should look at the date home study is due in and organise their time appropriately.

Years 10 to 11

Once per week
Once per week
Once per two week cycle

A guide of 45 minutes per home study set, however students are expected to be able to judge the amount of time to be spent on each piece of home study.

Recording and viewing set home study

Parents and students can view the home study set via 'MyHighcliffe'. Students are also encouraged to mark home study complete via 'MyHighcliffe', which will help parents in tracking which pieces are outstanding.
