ENGLISH

All sets are mixed ability in English. The numbers 1,2 or 3 do not reflect prior attainment. Students are taught the same curriculum with lesson materials designed to support and challenge students of all ability ranges. For further information, please contact the Subject Leader for English.

MATHS

KS3:

- Students are all in mixed prior attainment groups.
- The number associated with the set does not relate to prior ability (for example Ma1/x has the same prior attainment profile as Ma3/x).
- We use continuous assessment and termly assessments to monitor students progress.
- Homestudy is very important in maths as practice helps student retain the skills they have learnt in class, we use a number of different online platforms for maths homestudy.

Science Year 8

Key Information:

- Students are taught in mixed ability groups.
- Lessons are taught in science labs so that students gain experience in using key equipment safely.
- Students cover a variety of topics throughout the year from biology, chemistry and physics.
- Students are provided with a 'PLC' at the start of each topic summarising what they will learn.


Science Year 8



Retrieval Practice

The act of recalling learned information from memory (with little or no support) and every time that information is retrieved, or an answer is generated, it changes the original memory to make it **STRONGER!**



Pulling the information from your **long-term memory** back into your **working memory.**





RESPECTFUL



Greet at the Door: Where possible, your teacher will be at the classroom door to welcome you as you enter. You will greet your teacher, enter the classroom, take your seat and be ready to learn.



Strong Routines: Every lesson will have a starter activity so that the register can be taken promptly and, at the end of the lesson, teachers will check your understanding. You will take the quickest route to your lesson and arrive promptly with the correct equipment.

RESPONSIBLE



Retrieval Practice: Retrieval Practice helps your learning to 'stick'; you will complete retrieval practice activities regularly. You need to continue to use retrieval practice at home and independently, not just when directed.

Questioning: Your teacher will want to ask you questions to check your understanding regularly. You should be prepared to answer questions to the best of your ability, applying your key vocabulary.

PURPOSEFUL



Sustained Intense Concentration: Every lesson will have moments where you are expected to really focus, read or engage with discussion. You need to be prepared to focus all your attention, and not become distracted or <u>ever</u> distract others from their learning.



Best Work: Feedback will be given to help you to develop your learning. You will be expected to act upon this feedback, and may be asked to re-do work which is not an example of your best efforts. Delivering the same quality of education every single lesson.

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Year 8 Information Evening Mini Options Process

Mini Options Process

We are a two year GCSE School.

Some elements of some of the courses we offer have a heavy percentage on the practical elements in examinations at the end of Year 11.

With this in mind we offer students the opportunity to have a 'practice' run at picking one of these subjects to study in Year 9. Therefore giving them their first experience of 'choosing' something. This normally happens in May.

By asking students to state their preference for their 'Mini Option' it allows them to start to specialise as they move to Year 9. (*Please note that no choices now will restrict choices during year 9 when students opt for their GCSE courses*)

Mini Options Process

In May, students will have the opportunity to pick one of the following to study in more detail in Year 9:

- Music
- Drama
- PE Theory
- Dual Language (Spanish or French)

What ever they pick they would not study any of the others from the list above in Year 9.

For example;

If they choose music they would not study Drama, PE Theory or a second language in Year 9, however they would be able to pick these up as a GCSE in Year 10.

*All students still have to take part in their core PE lessons throughout Years 7-11

Mini Option Music

We have designed this course to give students a true insight in to the three main areas that they would be studying across Year 10 and 11 if they decide to study GCSE Music (**performing, composing** and **listening** and **analysing**).

We will deliver these 3 areas with a focus on Pop Music. The activities in place will demonstrate if students can access the course and is designed to make them "GCSE Ready".

Please note that undertaking music will also require students to access at least one tutor, lunchtime or after school enrichment music activity. As well as helping with/ taking part in school productions/ concerts

Mini Option Drama

Students selecting this course will be introduced to the three units that would be studied across Years 10 and 11.

These include: **Analysis and evaluation** of a set play as an introduction to the written paper, **Exploring and applying dramatic techniques** and devices within a devised piece of theatre, and exploration, **development and performance** of scripted extracts.

Students will be expected to perform in front of their peers and in performance evenings showcasing their class work.

Mini Option PE Theory

These lessons will be largely theory based in a classroom, preparing the students for either of the examination courses offered in Year 10.

This course covers the **anatomy and physiology** of the body including **Muscular, Skeletal, Respiratory** and **Circulatory** systems. Specifically looking at how the body reacts to **short term** and **long-term exercise**.

Students will also learn about and participate in **fitness testing**. Regular end of unit tests will help the students determine their potential future pathway into Year 10.

Mini Option Dual Language

This is an opportunity for students with an aptitude in Languages to study a second MFL separate from their existing main language.

Students will receive a separate 4 hours of MFL teaching of the second language giving them more time to study before deciding if they wish to take both French and Spanish at GCSE.

Mini Options Process

This process is done via their MyHighcliffe on an online form in May.

We ask that you help them with this process and have conversations with them at home.

This process is to prepare them for the GCSE options process that will happen in Year 9.
