Student Progress

Over Key Stage 3 (years 7 to 9) teachers will track the progress, attainment and attitude to learning of your child at both Course and Subject Unit level online. This tracking is designed to ensure that students are aware of their own learning and areas for development to enable them to make the maximum progress possible across all subjects. Subject areas and tutors will use this information to identify any relevant actions that can be taken to further support students where appropriate. The tracking of progress against skills and knowledge will increasingly give you information about the progress being made and offer you opportunities to support your child in their learning. Students will also have access to Learning Journeys detailing the content covered in each subject over the course of their time at Highcliffe.

Parents' Evenings are held for each year group giving you an opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their teachers.

Interim meetings with specific staff as required. Occasionally there may be a specific need to meet in addition to those above. Please contact the school to make an appointment and we will respond at the earliest point. Please remember if you arrive at school without an appointment the member of staff that you need to see will most likely be teaching.

The Student Organiser provides parents, specialist teachers and your child's tutor, the opportunity to share points of progress, items of news, and, items for recognition, clarification/resolution.
