Attitude to Learning – Guidelines

1 - Excellent	This student will be working to their full potential, and have shown ambition and drive by doing more than what is expected. Work will be completed to the best of the student's ability; work will be produced on time; attention and/or participation in class will be exemplary. Coursework and home study will be up to date. Behaviour is never an issue. Punctuality and attendance is always good. Uniform will always be worn correctly.
2 - <i>G</i> ood	This student will be working to their ability, and will have produced work on time and completed tasks. This student will have shown examples of having drive and ambition in their work. Coursework and home study will be up to date with requirements. This student will be working well and will be actively engaged in class. Punctuality and attendance will be mostly good. This student will respond well to advice and guidance. Some work produced will have been better than expected. Uniform will be worn correctly.
3 - Satisfactory	This student will be doing what is required, but no more. This student will respond when asked but may not offer any participation in class without being prompted. This student will generally be well-prepared and well-behaved with occasional lapses. Work will usually be handed in on time. Coursework and home study will be broadly on-line with requirements. Punctuality and attendance will be good with some lapses. Uniform will be worn correctly.
4 - Variable / Inconsistent	This student may occasionally display poor behaviour. This student may sometimes fail to complete tasks to the best of their ability and may sometimes fail to produce homework. This student may be off-task at times in class. Response in class will be variable and effort will be inconsistent. This student may sometimes be late; attendance may be uneven. Uniform will sometimes be incorrect.
5 - Unsatisfactory	This student will have shown poor levels of behaviour and/or a poor attitude towards their learning in class. Tasks will often not be completed. Home study will often not be completed. Punctuality and attendance may not be good. This student will have already been warned of a poor attitude and will not have responded to guidance. Uniform will often be incorrect.
