CitizenCard: We have recently been informed of some exciting news from CitizenCard. CitizenCards are printed in the following age-bands: 12-15, 16-17, 18+, 21+ and they have now introduced the LEALTA Discount scheme for cards in the 16 and over age bands. These discounts are offered in 100's of shops, restaurants, cinemas, bowling alleys, theme parks, buses and trains. Full details of these discounts are available on their web site: www.citizencard.com

Another exciting addition is the introduction their new Visa Prepaid CitizenCard, which might be more appropriate for Sixth Formers than the Classic Card issued in conjunction with Yellow Buses. Both types of card are free of charge, if issued through Mr Barnes at School.

The Visa Prepaid CitizenCard application is a bit more stringent than the Classic application form, as applicants must supply two passport photos. The Visa CitizenCard (copy attached) is brilliant for older students because it doubles as a Proof of Age card AND a Visa Debit card. You can't get into debt with it because it's a debit card, not a credit card.

It can be loaded free of charge by standing order and Students can spend the full amount loaded - there are no transaction fees, and they can make free of charge cash withdrawals at cash-back points (e.g. supermarkets and post offices). There is a small charge for withdrawing cash at an ATM.

Application forms for both the Classic Card and the Prepaid Visa Card are available from Student Support Office or the 6th Form Office and should be fully completed and forwarded to Mr Barnes for verification.

Please be advised that if you apply on-line you will have to pay £15.00, but if you apply via Mr Barnes, you'll get the cards **FREE OF CHARGE!** Please see www.citizencard.com for full details of all card types.
