Answers: Short: gap, hap, snap Long: hope, slope, cope

How does this affect the spelling? Which ones double the final consonant at the end?

Answer: the words with the short vowel sound before the final consonant.

**Enterprise Week:** This week is **Global Entrepreneurship Week** and the purpose is to highlight enterprise skills and qualities, and for you to understand that by developing these skills, you are improving your chances at success at school and in the world of work. Like with any skill, you will need to practice and develop enterprise skills, whether it is for personal gain or to help others (social enterprise). Enterprise does not always have to be about starting a successful business. There are several events

being run, such as the **Real Business Challenge** for Year 10's and an opportunity to take over the running of the **Red House Museum** for a day for some Year 9's. On Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> it is **National Toilet Day**, organised by Water Aid, which will be a feature of Citizenship lessons that day, with students being asked to create entries for a national competition.

Enterprise skills are an integral part of most of your lessons but try to be aware of relating your classwork and lesson activities to developing skills for your future. Some examples of enterprise skills are: team work, communication, creativity and innovation, positive attitude, organisation and planning, problem solving and leadership. How many are you using? #### Rules:

- The designs must be striking and original.
- The colour palette must be black, red, blue, yellow and green.
- Due to the nature of the reproduction process, artwork needs to be created using bold, flat colours. This could be done using felt pens, collage, paint, digital processes or any other appropriate medium.
- If using a computer programme the design must be original. Materials such as clip-art, photographs or pictures from the Internet are not allowed and will be disqualified.
- The design drawing must be the entrant's own original work, not defame, nor breach any
- copyright.
- Originals of the winning artwork will be required for production
