Remembrance Day Monday 11th November

"An Unseen" by Carol Ann Duffy

Down the quiet road, away, away, towards the dying time, love went, brave soldier, the song dwindling; walked to the edge of absence; all moments going, gone; bells through rain

to fall on the carved names of the lost. I saw love's child uttered, unborn, only by rain, then and now, all future past, an unseen. Has forever been then? Yes, forever has been.

Down the close darkening lanes they sang their way To the siding-shed, And lined the train with faces grimly gay.

Their breasts were stuck all white with wreath and spray As men's are, dead.
