This is an ideal opportunity to develop the garden and encourage more students to take part in gardening and related activities.

We intend to install more permanent and informative signs on the garden to keep students aware of what is being grown on site. We also wish to install an irrigation system to provide younger students with more time to get hands on gardening experience, and , in addition to this, we would like to net the beds in which berries and fruits are growing to reduce loss to birds and insects.

The garden plan for 2013/2014 is already being discussed in the Ecoteam and we are anxious to make the garden even more successful than it was last year. The Waitrose Community donation will help to increase the volume and quality of the plants we produce out of the garden and will allow more students to get firsthand experience of 'growing their own'.

2013/2014 Ecoteam: The beds in the Ecogarden are in the process of being cleared with the remnants of this year's harvest. We have also planted a winter crop of garlic across the top bed so that we have continued action in the garden over winter. While the weather remains reasonable we will be aiming to finish the tidying of the garden over the next couple of weeks in order to concentrate on planning for the next season. Any help is much appreciated; we meet in the Ecogarden after school on a Tuesday. As always, warm clothing and sensible footwear is mandatory!
