For example, I always used to struggle with the word "pronunciation" until I realised that it has the word "nun" in the middle of it - proNUNciation. It was that part that I would always forget. Similarly, "separate" has the words "a rat" in it which can help you remember the awkward bit - sepA RAT e.
