# Ecoclub (RCN)

The Ecoclub has got off to a flying start this year and for the first time we have a number of crops on the go before the end of January. We have designed two curriculum specific areas that should make the garden more accessible to a range of students. The 'medieval herb garden' will have a range of plants that one would have found in a typical botanical garden in the 15<sup>th</sup> century and the 'International' plot will have a range of novel crops that originate from a diverse array of countries.

We also have growing experiments taking place indoors looking at the suitability of artificial light sources for growing plants.

Next week we intend to get the new fruit trees dug into the Orchard area. Warm clothing and sensible footwear (not shoes) will be absolutely essential for this work!
