Young Blood Project

During the last eight weeks a group of year 7 students have been working on a Heritage Lottery funded 'Young Blood' exhibition for the Red House Museum in Christchurch. The project has led the students to explore the theme of 'Royal Blood' by learning about the history of Christchurch castle and the Empress Matilda during the time of The Anarchy.

As part of the project the students have visited the Red House Museum, Christchurch and Corfe Castles, seen a historical reenactment, and learned how to create graffiti art! In addition they have stayed after school to produce a 'Young Blood' film, as well as the actual exhibition panels - all designed using the students own ideas and historical knowledge, as well as museum artefacts and historical replicas.

The exhibition will be on at the Red House Museum this summer and opens with a day of activities this Saturday from 11:00 am - 4:00 pm. Everyone is welcome to enjoy this family event which will include archery, a procession with medieval music and theatre. The official opening of the exhibition will be at 3:00 pm.

Training is on Monday evenings in Highcliffe and we have matches on Saturday mornings throughout the season.


The Highcliffe Hawks encourages girls to improve their fitness and football skills and to enjoy playing as part of a team.


