General Notices

Break and Lunchtime Arrangements (MYP)

With the exception of the instances detailed below, it is expected that students spend break and lunchtime outside the school buildings.

Students can access the hard standing areas around the School where there are benches and tables. The school field can also be accessed at times when it is 'open' (red flags on the field indicate when it is 'closed'). Students should not gather outside the front of the main School building.

Areas inside the School that can be accessed at break and lunchtime:

- Toilets
- The Dining Hall
- The Library
- LS1 and IT2 for 'My Help Live'
- Year offices
- En8 for lunchtime detentions
- Clubs/activities supervised by a member of staff

Students are not to sit in the corridors during break and lunch time. Food should be eaten in the Dining Hall or outside the school buildings, not in the corridors. Litter must always be placed in bins.

'In' Days:

During times of bad weather, it may be considered unsuitable for students to be outside during break and lunch time. On days when the arrangements for such weather are to be put in place, students will be notified by email, on the information screens and on notice boards around school. On these days, students will be allowed to spend this time in the rooms allocated to each year group. The following table shows the rooms for each year group:

Year 7	En3, En4, En5, En6, En7
Year 8	ML2, ML3, ML4, ML5, ML6, En10
Year 9	Ma8, Ma9, Ma10, Hu2
Year 10	Ma1, Ma2, Ma3, Ma4
Year 11	Hu5, Hu6, Hu7, Hu8

Students are expected to behave in sensible manner in these rooms at all times and need to leave them clean and tidy at the end of break/lunch.

Students may only eat in classrooms when they are in the rooms allocated for their year group during these times of bad weather. Food must always be placed in bins.
