

Whole-School Literacy

Spelling Focus: Closing the Gap

Here are three words that are commonly misspelled:

- disappear
- disappoint
- appear

Questions:

1. Where are these words' Danger Zones?
2. What strategies would you use to remember the spellings? (There's a different strategy for each spelling.)

Here are some options:

Answers:

1. The Danger Zones for the above words are:
 - disappear (People sometimes double the "S" or forget to double the "P")
 - disappoint (Same as above)
 - appear (People sometimes forget to double the "P")

2. Here are some strategies:

Remember that the prefix almost never changes. So "Dis" is always "Dis".

"disappoint" and "disappear" are made of a prefix + a stem:

- dis + appear
- dis + appoint

Remember that the prefix never changes

3. How about "appear" and "appoint"? What can we do to remind ourselves that they are a double "p"?

Can you think of a way to remember?
