The following guidance is intended as an approximate amount of time to spend on home study. It is likely that the time spent on home study will vary considerably and will increase in the preparation for tests and examinations.

- Year 7 and 8 students should spend 30 minutes on each piece of home study
- Year 9 students should spend 45 minutes on each piece of home study
- Year 10 and 11 students should spend between 45 and 60 minutes on each piece of home study


